### **Registration and security:**

The conference starts at 09:00 on February 14<sup>th</sup>. Registration will be open from 08:30. There will be a security check coming into the conference and all participants are therefore encouraged to arrive in good time.

All participants will receive a badge at registration. To collect the badge participants, need to be able to provide photo ID. The badge will be required to enter the venue both days of the conference and to enter City Hall for the dinner on the evening of February 14<sup>th</sup>.

The area around the venue will be closed off for traffic by the police. Please be informed that participants arriving with car (private car or taxi) need to provide the attached “proof of participation” to be let through the police barrier.

### *VIP*

Ministers and Deputy Ministers will be provided with a VIP badge that will give them access to a VIP-room at the venue. The VIP-room will only be available for participants with a VIP badge.

### **Dinner at Stockholm City Hall on the evening of February 14<sup>th</sup>**

On the evening of February 14<sup>th</sup>, the City of Stockholm will host a buffé dinner for all participants at Stockholm City Hall.

There will be a VIP table for UN dignitaries, Ministers and Deputy Ministers.  
There will be transport by bus available for all participants from the venue to City Hall.

### **Transport:**

Arlanda Express - Train to Stockholm Central Station (departs every 15 minutes, 20 minutes to Centre).

The Flygbussarna Airport Coach operates from the airport to the city Centre (20 minutes travel time).

### **Languages:**

The working languages for the conference will be English and Spanish. Translation will be available for the plenary sessions and workshop A and E.

### **Weather in Stockholm:**

The weather in Stockholm in February can vary between -10 Degrees Celsius with snow and +5 Degrees Celsius with rain.

### **Electricity:**

The power sockets in Sweden are of type F (also known as “Schuko”). This socket also works with plug C and plug E. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.

If the standard voltage in your country is in between 220-240 V, it is possible for you to use your electric appliances in Sweden. If the standard voltage in your country is in the range of 100 V -127 V, you will need a voltage converter.

### **Information about currency and payments:**

The currency in Sweden is SEK. Major credit cards (some restrictions may apply to American Express) are widely accepted throughout Sweden at banks, hotels, stores, restaurants, taxis, car rental companies and for bus, metro and train tickets.

Please note that some establishments do not accept cash. To pay or withdraw cash with your credit card it requires that you have a card with chip or PIN code. The older magnetic-stripe cards will not work.
